



On-Track means you are performing in a manner that will allow you to graduate in 4 years by:


PASSING ALL 4 CORE COURSES



On Track: The ABC's

- 1. Attendance: 95% This means you should miss *no more than* ONE day of school each month.
- 2. <u>Behavior</u>: No Detentions and take accountability for your choices.
- Credit Attainment:

ON TRACK: Pass Four Core and One More: This means you are passing ALL CLASSES!

FIRMLY ON TRACK: A's and B's: This means you should have a grade of 80% or higher in all of your classes!









WHAT IS TITLE I?

- The federal government provides Title I funding to states each year. These funds are disseminated to each School District (LEA). The District is then responsible for distributing these funds to all our schools based on two criteria:
 - Formula based on low-income status
 - ❖ Title I School Designation
- ❖ Each Spring during the budget process, our school decides how best to use our Title I funds based on a needs assessment with the guidance of school leadership, parents and community members.

RIGHT TO KNOW 4 WEEK LETTER

You will be notified in writing when your child is taught for 4 or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not Appropriately State Certified.


STATE ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND ASSESSMENTS
